On November 1st after the 9:30 Liturgy will be a Memorial Service (Panakhyda) on occasion of 65 Anniversary of death of Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky

Metropolitan Andrey Sheptytsky died on 1 November 1944. Blessed with extraordinary spiritual charisma, at the age of thirty-six he became head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. During his 44-year tenure, he guided the Church and Ukrainian society through two world wars and seven changes of regime: Austrian, Russian, Ukrainian, Polish, Soviet, Nazi and Soviet. He worked tirelessly for reconciliation between ethnic groups and left a rich legacy of writings on social issues and spirituality. He developed modern methods of ministry, founded the Studite and Ukrainian Redemptorist orders, other religious communities, a hospital, the national Museum, the Theological Academand sponsored various religious, cultural and educational institutions.

Canada Public Health Recommendation: Be Prepared

The H1N1 flu virus is a new strain of pandemic influenza which is different than the seasonal flu. People have no natural immunity to protect against this virus. The H1N1 flu virus emerged in April 2009. The H1N1 flu virus has caused primarily mild illness in Canada, but Canadians need to be prepared to respond to a potentially more severe form of the virus that may emerge this fall.

The H1N1 flu virus – also known as human swine influenza – is a respiratory illness that affects the nose, throat and lungs. This virus usually affects pigs, but has been transferred to humans. Symptoms are almost always: cough and fever; Also common symptoms are: fatigue, muscle aches, sore throat, headache, decreased appetite, runny nose; Sometimes even: nausea, vomiting, diarrhea.

The H1N1 flu virus is contagious and is spread the same way as regular seasonal influenza. This happens when an infected person coughs or sneezes and their germs enter the nose, eyes, or throat of another person. The germs can also rest on hard surfaces like counters and doorknobs, and can be picked up on hands and transmitted to the respiratory system when someone touches their mouth and/or nose. It is not possible to catch it by eating pork or pork products or through blood transfusions.

More research is being done on how long a person can be infectious (be able to spread the virus to others), but it is believed that this period is for one day before the onset of symptoms and continues for approximately seven days after symptoms have started. The time it takes between being infected and experiencing symptoms is between two and seven days.

If you get flu-like symptoms and are pregnant or have underlying health problems contact your healthcare provider. If you get flu-like symptoms and are otherwise healthy, you should stay home to recover. If your symptoms worsen or you experience difficulty breathing or serious shortness of breath, it is important to seek medical attention.

Antivirals are drugs used for the early treatment of influenza. If taken shortly after getting sick (within 48 hours), they can reduce influenza symptoms, shorten the length of illness and potentially reduce the serious complications of influenza. Antivirals do not prevent you from getting sick. Canada has a National Antiviral Stockpile of 55 million doses of two antiviral drugs – Tamiflu and Relenza. Both are effective in treating H1N1 flu virus. This stockpile is enough for all Canadians who will need and want treatment. Antivirals are recommended for the treatment of moderate to severe illness, and for people at risk of severe disease. Your doctor will decide if treatment is right for you.

Prevention: Wash hands often with soap or alcohol-based hand sanitizer; Keep common surfaces disinfected; Cough and sneeze into your arm, instead of your hand; If you are sick, stay home until your symptoms are gone and you feel well enough to participate in all activities; If you get flu-like symptoms and are pregnant, have underlying health problems or if your symptoms get worse, contact your doctor.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETING OF PARISH & COMMUNITY ST. GEORGE'S YOUTH CENTRE - NOVEMBER 22nd 2009, 2:00 PM

The Saskatoon Health Region has made a strong indication of interest in a long term lease of St. Georges Youth Centre. This lease would involve the creation of a second storey in the Hall, renting the main floor and second storey to the Health Region, and retention of the basement level by the Parish for its own programs and social functions.

Therefore this Special General Meeting of the Parish has been called by the President of Parish Council as an informational session to hear and discuss the programs and services that may be offered by the Saskatoon Health Region in the Hall. Representatives from the Health Region will be in attendance to outline their goals, describe their programs and services, and to answer questions.

A lease arrangement with Saskatoon District Health is expected to provide:

- an opportunity for the Parish to assist the surrounding community by supplying facilities for healing and for positive development in the Pleasant Hill neighborhood,
- extensive, and much needed, renovation and improvement of the Hall,
- financial stability for the Hall, and in turn, the needed financial stability for the Parish to assist in the restoration of the Cathedral and the construction of a new Rectory and Residence.

The anticipated arrangement with Saskatoon Health would fulfill initiatives taken, over the past three years, by the Parish Membership as a whole, and by Parish Council. As you may recall, at a Special General Meeting of the Parish in October 2006, the Membership, recognizing that the Hall has been operating at a substantial deficit over at least the past decade, voted to support efforts by Parish Council to "*retain the Parish Hall and make it usable, marketable and profitable*"

Subsequently at a special meeting in June of 2008, Parish Council approved the concept of installing a second floor with a view to commercial rental of the Hall and, in the spring of 2009, the Eparchial Consulters granted permission for the Parish to hire the necessary professional services required to prepare designs and establish a business plan for Hall renovation and lease. Early this summer, it was reported to Parish Council that a real estate firm had begun discussions with the Saskatoon Health Region, and, through September and October, the interest of the Health Region has become more serious. Parish Council has now engaged professional project management services to assist in further development.

The Special General Meeting on November 22nd will be an opportunity for Parish Members to become more fully informed on these matters. Please plan to attend.
